

ORDER

Sri M.C. Gaur, Deputy Registrar (S.R.), has reported that at the time of filing appeals and revisions, his section insists on filing of typed copies of certified copies of the judgments and orders impugned. He has referred to three orders—an undated order of Justice Sudhir Narain and orders dated 18.01.2002 and 16.04.2002 of Justice S.K. Agarwal in compliance whereof such a practice has been adopted by his section. When these orders were issued, certified copies of judgments and orders were in all probability either handwritten or typed on rice paper, which in due course of time became illegible. Presently, certified copies of judgments and orders are ordinarily computer generated and are legible. Since filing of certified copies, typed copies and photostat copies burdens the record and makes it prolix, it is necessary to discontinue the practice of filing additional copies other than the copies of the impugned judgment and order in appeal or revision, provided it is legible and printed on durable paper.

The Stamp Reporting Section is directed to discontinue the earlier practice and accept the memo of appeal or revision if it is accompanied by documents prescribed in Rule 8 Chapter IX of the Rules of the Court, 1952 provided they are legible and printed on durable paper. In case the impugned judgment or order is handwritten or is illegible, a typed copy of the judgment and order must be taken by the Stamp Reporting Section.
